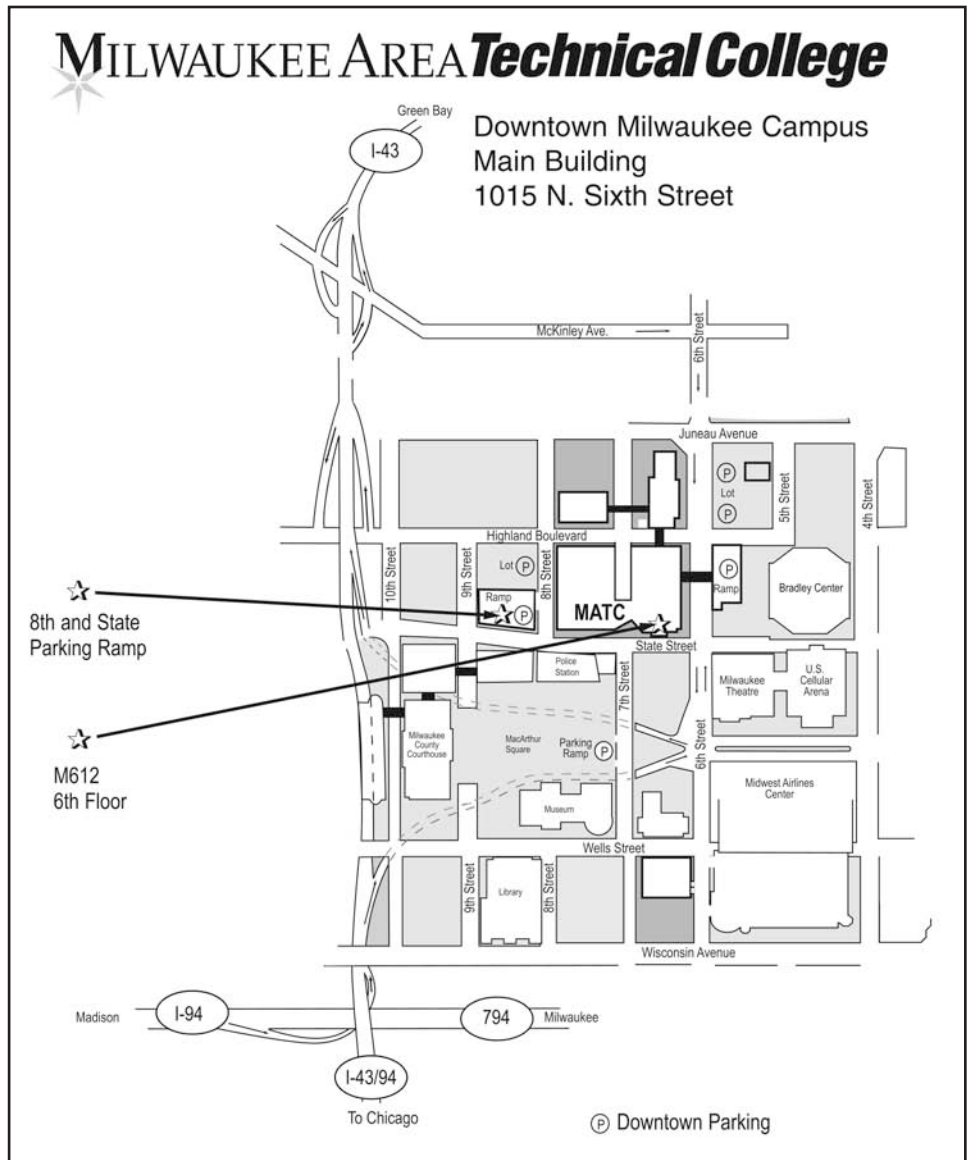


# Making Democracy Work<sup>®</sup>

There is PARKING on the corner of State and Eighth Streets. If you park in the Eighth Street Ramp, you may bring your ticket to the registration table for validation for the \$5.00 rate.
